Humility - 1

Proverbs 22:4 - By **humility** *and* the fear of the LORD *are* riches, and honour, and life.

Proverbs 15:33 - The fear of the LORD *is* the instruction of wisdom; and before honour *is* **humility**.

Proverbs 16:19 - Better *it is to be* of an **humble** spirit with the lowly, than to divide the spoil with the proud.

Proverbs 18:12 - Before destruction the heart of man is haughty, and before honour *is* **humility**.

Proverbs 29:23 - A man's pride shall bring him low: but honour shall uphold the **humble** in spirit.

James 4:6, 10 - But he giveth more grace. Wherefore he saith, God resisteth the proud, but giveth grace unto the **humble**... **Humble** yourselves in the sight of the Lord, and he shall lift you up.

Definitions

Contrite: Having deep sorrow and grief for one's sins; being brokenhearted and bruised inwardly for your sins (see Psalm 34:18 and Psalm 51:17).

Humble: To repent of wrong doing (see Isaiah 1:16-18); to make contrite; modest (see Romans 12:3-10); meek, submissive to God and His Word; opposite of proud, haughty, arrogant, or rude (see 1 Peter 5:5-7).

Humility: The act of being humble; freedom from pride, haughtiness and arrogance; having a modest estimate of one's worth (see Romans 12:3); submitting to Divine Will (see Isaiah 1:19-20).

Meek: Mild tempered; soft and gentle; not proud; not easily provoked or irritated; appropriately humble, submissive to God's Word (teachable); non-complaining (see Matthew 5:5-16 and Matthew 11:25-30).

Meekness: Humility, obeying God without murmuring (see 2 Corinthians 10:1-7 and Galatians 5:6, 13-26).
